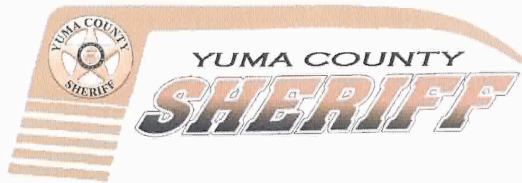
“Lone Wolf” an aggressive training course designed to prepare officers to effectively respond alone and in pairs to an active shooter.

Statistically a life is taken every 15 seconds once an active gunman begins a shooting rampage. Historically gunmen do not attempt to escape once the shooting begins but either give up or take their own lives once confronted by authorities. It is imperative that law enforcement officers act quickly to stop the loss of lives. In most cases this may mean going it alone until additional officers arrive.

The “Lone Wolf” will cover the theories behind life preservation and the one/two officer response to an active gunman. The simulation based scenarios will teach students how to apply those theories correctly. Emphasis will be placed on how to stop the loss of life and successfully engage the threat.

At the culmination of the course students will walk away with an understanding of the dynamics of an active shooter and the skills necessary to increase the chances of life preservation.

To my fellow Law Enforcement community,

There is a shooter in your local high school. Three kids have been shot when you arrive on scene and you can hear shots being fired. You've learned from tragedies such as Columbine that you cannot wait for cover. It is too far away, you hear shots still being fired, and kids are screaming in horror right now. You enter the school and tactically move toward the sound of gunfire walking past two bodies of students that have been fatally shot. You arrive in a short hallway of classrooms and are ten yards from a young man with a pistol. You give him commands to place the gun on the floor and for him to get on the ground. He throws the gun down and starts to run toward a classroom.....What do you do?

I am Yuma County Sheriff Chad Day, and I'm writing this letter to highly recommend the courses offered by TacOne Consulting. My perspective is of a former SWAT operator that has gone through some TacOne courses, and an administrator who's agency has received the benefit of TacOne training. The owner/instructor Joe Deedon, while very qualified because of his extensive real life experience with these subjects, is a very naturally gifted teacher and communicator. 
