

“Lone Wolf” Single/Two Officer Active Shooter Response & Officer Down/Mass Casualty Triage

“Lone Wolf” is an aggressive training course designed to prepare officers to effectively respond alone, and in pairs to an active shooter. The “Lone Wolf” will cover the theories behind life preservation and the one/two officer response to an active shooter. Our Simunition®-based scenarios will teach students how to apply those theories correctly. Training will emphasize successfully engaging the threat, and how to stop the loss of life.

During this 10 hour course of instruction attendees will learn to:

- Identify current active shooter trends
- Confront the shooter alone if needed
- Communicate and move in pairs if cover officer is present
- Target identification
- Use of force considerations

At the end of this program students will have the knowledge, mindset, and skills necessary to aggressively and safely respond to an active shooter situation alone or in pairs.

Officer Down/Mass Casualty Care provides the latest medical training used by the military and law enforcement to treat major bleeding, trauma, and shock in a hostile environment. Attendees will learn many different methods of gaining control of a traumatic injury. They will also learn to properly evacuate the casualty to a safe location for further treatment or to identify other life threatening emergencies. This course will finalize the process by training to start the vital triaging process in the event of mass casualties.

Law enforcement continues to become more dangerous everyday across the United States, Officers need advanced training to have the skills to make a difference. This course will challenge you mentally, physically and will give you knowledge needed to self-aid and care for others. This course will have hands on exercises and “force on force” scenarios to help students understand the application of methods learned. Ask yourself this, if you are on a traffic stop, on scene at a domestic and get injured do you know what to do? You respond to a shooting with several casualties who needs to be transported first and why? Emergency Medical Services response is an average of five minutes this is if the scene is safe to provide emergency care. You or someone else can bleed to death in 3-5 minutes get the knowledge and training needed to be the difference and save lives.

Joe Deedon was employed as a Law Enforcement Officer with the Jefferson County Sheriff’s Office, Colorado, from 08/2002 to 06/2010. He was a tactical operator with the Jefferson County Regional SWAT team from 2005 -2009. Joe is a Kaminsky certified FTO and his last assignment was in the Patrol Division. He has also instructed newly hired Officers and Deputies from the Denver metro area that attended a Regional P.O.S.T. certified Academy in the following areas; Building Searches, RAID, Traffic Stops and Crowd Control. In November of 2006 Joe received the Distinguished Service Medal and the Park County Sheriff’s Commendation for his actions during the Platte Canyon High School incident. In May of 2007 Joe received the Medal of Valor for his actions during an officer involved shooting with a barricaded gunman. In May of 2008 Joe received the Distinguished Service Medal for his involvement in a high speed chase and apprehension of a shooting suspect. In February of 2011 Joe completed a mission in Afghanistan with the Marine Corp as an Embedded Police Mentor. Since 2007 Joe has built, coordinated and conducted active shooter and S.W.A.T. training for officers from several hundred different agencies in 42 states, as founder and president of TAC*ONE Consulting.
